Welcome to the New Year! We hope everyone had a joyful holiday season. Speaking of holidays, Lubbock Meals on Wheels is busy planning another Mardi Gras celebration. Mark your calendar for **Fat Tuesday, February 21**, and join us for a fun-filled evening.

Mardi Gras 2012 will include over 35 food booths (with selections from your favorite local restaurants), live jazz music by the Shinn/Turner Dixieland Jazz Band, a large silent auction, and cash bars. Once again, the event will take place in the Civic Center Exhibit Hall which is large enough to accommodate many guests, children's activities, and various entertainers such as jugglers, dancers, and clowns. Colorful masks and beads will be available to make the evening even more festive.
